

**East Pikeland Township
Board of Supervisors Meeting
September 6, 2016**

A public meeting of the Board of Supervisors of East Pikeland Township was held on Tuesday, September 6, 2016 at the Township Building, 1158 Rapps Dam Road, Kimberton. Present were Chairman Ron Graham, Vice Chairman Rusty Strauss, Supervisor Ben Campbell and Township Manager Kim Moretti.

Mr. Graham called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Minutes

Mr. Strauss made a MOTION to approve the August 2, 2016 Board of Supervisors meeting minutes. Mr. Campbell seconded the motion and the minutes were approved.

Department Reports

Township Manager – Mrs. Moretti reported that in August she worked on the Kimberton Park amphitheater project. The amphitheater will be constructed this fall. Utilities will not be installed until 2017. She has been working with the Cutler Group and Toll Brothers to finalize subdivision plans for recording; working with special counsel on a settlement agreement for Pikeland Glen; and coordinating final work to be completed at Kimberton Meadows. Outdoor Movie Night is scheduled for Saturday, September 24th at Kimberton Park. Movie to be shown is Zootopia. The Historic Walking Tour held on August 18th was a great success with 250 participants.

Public Works – Posted. 17 township roads were repaired/re-paved in August at a cost of \$389,000.

Police Department – Sgt. Wilson provided the report. Officers responded to 20 accidents in August, issued 85 citations and made 8 felony/misdemeanor arrests. In order to address complaints about speeding on Mill Lane the police department monitored the road with an electronic counter for one week. Over that seven day period there were 169 cars on the road and only 2 were over the 25 mph speed limit. Officer Smith has been attending accident reconstruction classes, working towards certification. During Child Safety Week the Police Department will be at area daycare centers demonstrating to parents the proper way to secure a car seat.

Resident Jim Martin reported that a property on West Beacon Drive appears to be abandoned and asked if the police could check it out. Mrs. Moretti also responded that the Zoning Officer can look into it.

Planning Commission – John Schott reported that the Planning Commission will be resuming workshops to discuss Kimberton Village zoning this month. There are no applications under review; however there was a presentation from Altair on the EcoVillage concept at the last meeting.

Old Business

Mr. Strauss made a MOTION to approve the 2017 Police Pension Fund Minimum Municipal Obligation in the amount of \$62,066. Motion was seconded by Mr. Campbell and approved by all.

Mr. Strauss made a MOTION to approve the 2017 Non-Uniformed Personnel Pension Fund Minimum Municipal Obligation in the amount of \$9,952. Motion was seconded by Mr. Campbell and approved by all.

New Business

Mr. Campbell made a MOTION to accept the resignation of Jon Lilienfeld from the Zoning Hearing Board, effective September 1, 2016. Mr. Strauss seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Mr. Campbell made a MOTION to appoint Shawn Quinnan to the Zoning Hearing Board, effective September 1, 2016, with term expiring December 31, 2017. Mr. Strauss seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Mr. Campbell made a MOTION to accept the resignation of Raymond Haas from the Public Works Department, effective September 16, 2016. Mr. Strauss seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. Mr. Graham commented that Ray has been a faithful, hardworking employee and will be missed.

Mr. Campbell made a MOTION to authorize the Open Space Committee to obtain an appraisal for 2161 Kimberton Road. Mr. Strauss seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Mr. Campbell made a MOTION to authorize the Open Space Committee to obtain an appraisal for 30 Prizer Road. Mr. Strauss seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Jonathan Gayl asked if appraisal reports could be posted on the township website. Mrs. Moretti responded that the reports are rather lengthy and if he is interested she can make copies of pertinent pages for him.

Mr. Graham commented that these two parcels fit in nicely with the plan to preserve open space and create a trail system in Kimberton Village.

Public Comment

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 7:20 pm.
