General

- **Snyder's Mill & Grange Signage** - Ms. Ruzicka presented updated copy for the Grange and Snyder's Mill signage for member review.
- **Township Strategic Planning Meeting** - Mr. Garrison updated the members with the proposed plans for the East Pikeland Elementary School building. He stated that the township is interested in acquiring the property and have hired a consultant that will evaluate the general condition of the building, what state programs might be available for rehab and possible uses for the facility.
